## PHILANTHROPIC EDUCATIONAL ORGANIZATION (P.E.O.)

**P.E.O. (Philanthropic Educational Organization) has been celebrating women helping women reach for the stars for more than 150 years.**

Through membership, the P.E.O. Sisterhood has brought together more than half a million women in the United States and Canada who are passionate about helping women advance through education while supporting and motivating them. In addition to the educational philanthropies, the P.E.O. Sisterhood provides a framework of support and community for all members.

What started with a bond of friendship among seven women in Mount Pleasant, Iowa, is now one of the oldest women’s organizations in North America with nearly 5,800 chapters.

Headquartered in Des Moines, Iowa, members are passionate about P.E.O.’s mission: to celebrate the advancement of women; educate women through scholarships, grants, awards, loans and stewardship of Cottey College; and motivate women to achieve their highest aspirations.

**The P.E.O. Sisterhood is a nonprofit organization that has helped more than 119,000\* women pursue educational goals by providing over \$398 million\* in educational assistance, making a difference in women’s lives through six philanthropies and a foundation:**

<b>P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund (ELF)</b>	A loan fund established in 1907 to lend money to qualified women students to assist them in securing a higher education.	Has loaned <b>\$235.9 million*</b>
<b>P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund (IPS)</b>	A fund established in 1949 to provide scholarships for women from other countries for graduate study in the U.S. or Canada.	Has provided <b>\$45.4 million*</b> in scholarships.
<b>P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education (PCE)</b>	Established in 1973 to provide need-based grants to women in the U.S. and Canada whose education has been interrupted and who find it necessary to return to school to complete a degree or certification that will improve their marketable skills for employment to support themselves and/or their families.	Has given <b>\$67.6 million*</b> in grants.
<b>P.E.O. Scholar Awards (PSA)</b>	Established in 1991 to provide substantial merit-based awards for women of the U.S. and Canada who are pursuing a doctoral-level degree at an accredited college or university.	Has awarded <b>\$32.1 million*</b> in scholarships.
<b>P.E.O. STAR Scholarship (STAR)</b>	Established in 2009 to provide scholarships for exceptional women in their final year of high school to attend an accredited postsecondary educational institution in the U.S. or Canada in the next academic year.	Has given <b>\$17.2 million*</b> in scholarships.
<b>Cottey College</b>	A nationally ranked, fully accredited, independent, liberal arts and sciences college for women located in Nevada, Missouri, has been owned/supported by P.E.O. since 1927 and offers baccalaureate and associate degrees in a variety of majors. Cottey College, a debt-free institution, welcomes women from around the world.	
<b>P.E.O. Foundation</b>	A nonprofit corporation established in 1961 to encourage tax-deductible giving to the educational and charitable projects of the P.E.O. Sisterhood. It is a service to the Sisterhood.	

### P.E.O. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

International Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood is governed by a five-member volunteer executive board, with Patricia L. Brolin-Ribi, Idaho, currently serving as the president of International Chapter (through Convention of International Chapter in September 2023).

Local chapters report to state, provincial or district chapters that are governed by International Chapter.
